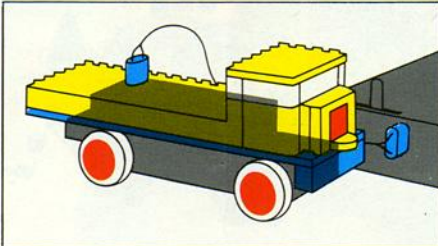
Karen and Tom each have a set and they often combine them. They get some very big ideas.

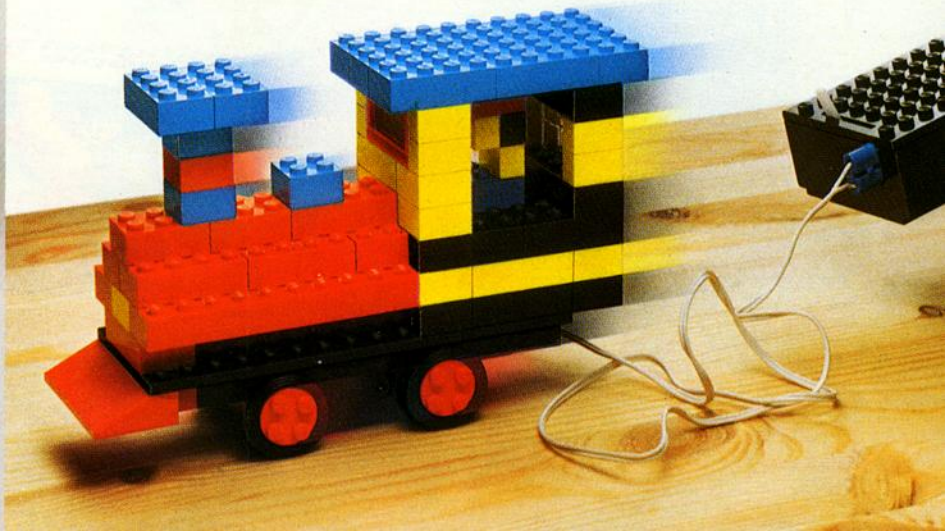


# LEGO Motor

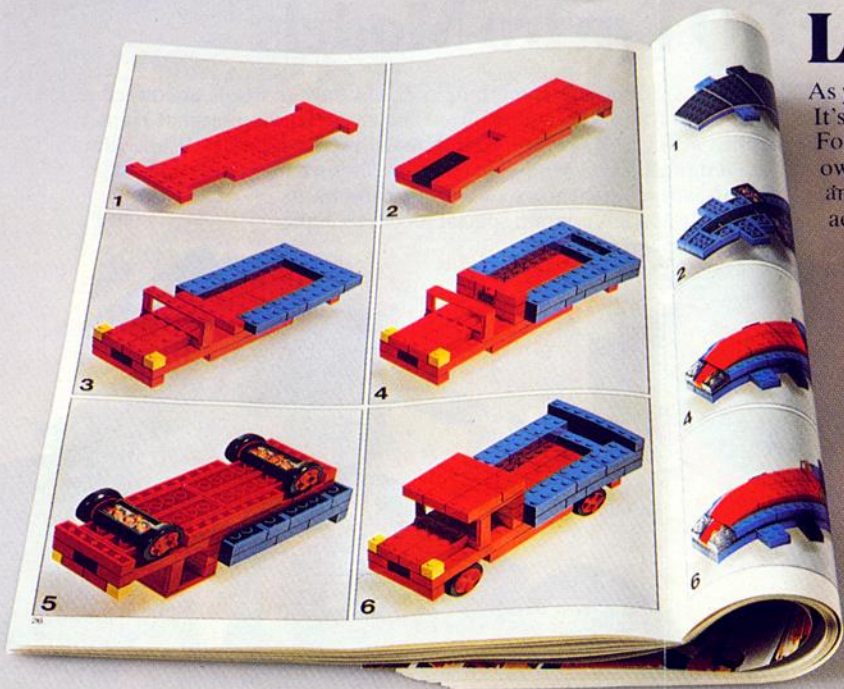
